What is the CASA resource library?

The CASA Resource Library contains books, videos, and brochures on topics pertaining to social, psychological, mental, and physical needs of dependent children in the court system. Items can be checked out by staff and volunteers for up to a month.

How do I receive the library materials?

The resource library is conveniently located online at www.azcasa.org under "Library."

How long can I keep the library materials?

Books can be checked out for one month and videos for two weeks. However, you are responsible for supplying return postage for the materials or dropping them off at the CASA state office at the Arizona Supreme Court building in Phoenix, Arizona.

What about training credits?

Training credit is available for books at 30 minutes per 50 pages read, with a maximum of 3 hours. Video credit translates to 1 credit per each minute of video time. (60min. = 60 credits)

How much training credit is available for completing online training?

Training credit ranges from 30 minutes to 60 minutes of credit per module. You receive credit by taking an exam at the end of the module which is emailed to the State office. You must answer all exam answers correctly to receive credit. You will then receive an email acknowledging the successful completion of the modules along with the amount of credit earned.
